

CHAIRMAN'S ANNUAL REPORT April 2023 – March 2024

Speed monitoring activities have continued throughout the year by the Road Safety Group and, on behalf of the Parish Council, they are now seeking details of a new device which focuses on a specific area of road and photographs persistent speed limit abusers. This would be a most helpful and reliable deterrent. After due consideration of residents' views, the Parish Council have resolved to accept the NLC proposal for the establishment of double yellow lines along Spruce Lane and Abbey Road, made in a response to resident's pleas for greater access in both areas. Repairs and alterations to various pavements to improve pedestrian safety and to aid disabled scooter riders, are still awaited from NLC.

In February, a Planning Application to change the use of former farm buildings at Ryehill Farm, Ulceby Road, to possible wider industrial use was rejected by the Parish Council because it was feared that such extended local use would be detrimental to our village community. A member of Greystoke Land addressed the March meeting regarding that company's proposed development of an Artificial Intelligence Data Centre to be constructed beyond the Truck Stop on Killingholme Road, which has the full support of North Lincs Council. This would be the first development of it's kind in England and would provide work for 3000 persons during the construction stage and then offer approximately 370 well-paid permanent jobs



when complete. The site would provide a biodiversity net gain, and waste heat from the same would support on-site greenhouses and possibly add to heating Immingham Swimming Pool. When the full application is submitted later in the year, the Greystoke representative will return to respond to further questioning.



PARKING ON THE HIGHWAY

Tips on safe Parking

Remember...

The highway is for the free flow and passage of moving vehicles.

If you park on the road:

Do it correctly, with all wheels on the roadway;

Do not inconvenience other road and footway users.

If you have a driveway, please use it Correctly parked vehicles on the highway can help to reduce other vehicles' speed.

Humberside Police can prosecute for dangerous or unnecessary obstruction -

BE WARNED!

Some people are parking vehicles on the road, preventing residents getting in and out of their drives and also causing inconvenience to other road users.

To make sure you don't cause problems:

Do not park:

on a footway or verge where the kerb has been lowered within 10 metres of a junction where it will obstruct other road users at night: facing oncoming traffic without lights on roads where the speed limit is more than 30mph without lights if your vehicle weighs more than 1,525kg unladen (ie 30cwt approx)

PLEASE CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOG MAKE ULCEBY A MORE PLEASANT PLACE TO LIVE IN



If you fail to clean up after your dog you can be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice, or if the case goes to court, a fine of up to £1,000. Being unaware that the dog has fouled, or not having a suitable means of removing the faeces is not a reasonable excuse for failing to clean up after your dog. Make sure you pick it up and put it in a bin, or take it home with you.

Dog faeces are:-

- 1. Dangerous because they are a slipping hazard to people using the footpath.
- 2. Unpleasantly Smelly and a Health Hazard, when picked up on shoes or the wheels of pushchairs and wheelchairs and trampled into the carpets of innocent people's homes.
- 3. Dangerous because they may contain the eggs of a parasite (the roundworm toxocara canis) that can cause blindness and other health problems, especially in young children.
 - The eggs may be ingested when passed to the mouth by the hands this can occur not only through contact with dogs but also other inanimate objects including the wheels of toys and the soles of shoes or contaminated soil or carpets.



Flooding guidance



Flood water from highways, run off from fields or issues with land drainage: Contact your local council – you can find their contact details. Most flooding caused by rainwater will subside once the rain stops. If it's causing a danger to life call 101 or 999.

Clearing up debris left over from the flooding: Speak to your local council to get help to clean up silt and mud left behind by receding rain or flood water. If there's been any flooding from our sewers we'll be out as soon as we can to clear up but only once we've helped customers who have flooding inside their homes or problems with their water supply. Thanks for bearing with us.

A new water or sewerage issue: The quickest way to tell us about a problem is to do it online https://www.anglianwater.co.uk/your-local-area/report-an-issue/ - online issues are dealt with exactly the same as raising a problem over the phone.

If you're having trouble flushing your toilet after a lot of heavy rain, it's likely that our sewer network is full of rain and groundwater and things won't get any better until that excess water has a chance to flow away. We know it's not nice but try not to flush as much as you can until we can get out to you. If heavy rainfall has caused problems across the area we might be having to prioritise customers whose homes are flooding internally or who have no water coming from their taps, and might not be able to get out to you as quickly as you'd like.


