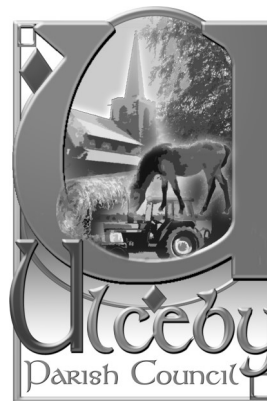

Hello everyone,

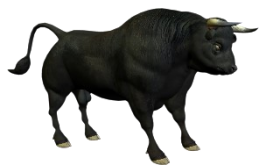
This is my first article for the Ulceby Parish Link magazine, having taken over as chair of the Parish Council from May this year, and it is a series of thanks to people for their service to the village community. First of all, I would like to thank Dawn Macefield. Dawn will be known to those of us who have had children attend Ulceby St Nicholas Primary School, since she was the Office Manager at the school for many years and has been the chair of the Parish Council since 2010. It was due to her leadership that we secured the land for a community garden rather than it being set aside for future planned development. During my time as a fellow councillor, I have often admired her tenacious yet understated approach, and it will certainly be difficult for me to follow her in the role. Thankfully, she will remain a member of the council.

The war memorial is the focal point of the village and was refurbished recently. This was a voluntary initiative taken by Cllr Lucy Burdin, supported by the Parish Council and with additional assistance provided by Will Freudenberg and staff from Internetty. policing, and Highways England to ensure that the roadworks being conducted on the A180 did not result in the diversionary route directing traffic through the village except in an emergency. It has been thanks to their perseverance that in recent years we have seen the installation of the pedestrian crossing, the establishment of a traffic weight limit and the illuminated speed signs. Although many people adhere to speed limits through the village there continue to be cases of extreme speeds being recorded - 90 mph on Spruce Lane and 111 mph on Brocklesby Road in the last quarter. I know from conversations with fellow dog walkers along Brocklesby Road that routine speeding gives cause for concern on the stretch of road immediately outside the village. Traffic calming measures are under discussion, but options are limited due to the A and B road classification and the routine use of the main roads by agricultural vehicles.

The village has grown in recent years, and aside from welcoming you to the village community, I encourage those who have moved into the village to participate in community led activities.

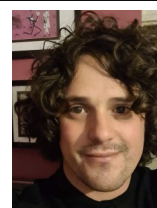

Ulceby Pre-School was set up in 1992 by three friends Carole, Pat and Shirley. They dedicated their time and efforts to help support Ulceby and the surrounding village. The setting has come a long way since it first started, now providing childcare for children aged two to eleven years with currently fifty children on the books.

It is a small charity that relies on funding, grants and paying customers to keep the setting running. Unfortunately the roof has started leaking in several places and while this is safe for it to keep running it will need to carry out these repairs to be able to keep providing the service.

Several quotes have been obtained for a repair which will cost £6,000 and a full roof replacement that will cost £14,400. Unfortunately they do not have an excessive amount of surplus cash to make the necessary repairs so will be carrying out various fundraising activities.

We appreciate it is hard times for everyone so any donations, no matter how big or small, will be greatly appreciated to enable them to continue providing this service.

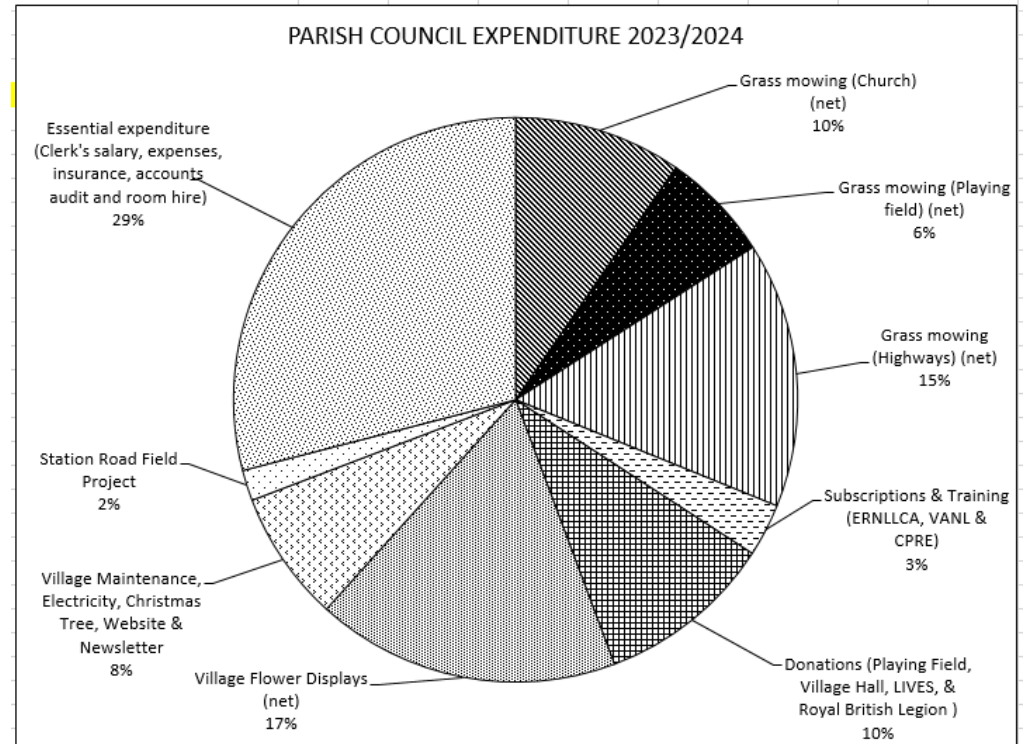

WHERE DOES YOUR MONEY GO?

Of the amount each household pays to North Lincolnshire Council in Council Tax, approximately £17 is passed to Ulceby Parish Council in the precept. A proportion of this is spent on essential items, and the remainder is spent locally to benefit the village, as the Parish Council thinks fit. Some is used to improve the appearance of the village, such as flower displays and grass cutting around the church and playing field, and some to support local groups and organisations. If you are involved in such a group which is in need of funding, or are interested in setting up a new group and would like to apply for some financial assistance, please contact Karen Pickering, the Clerk to the Council (details on back page).

The precept was set at £20,000 for 2023/24, and it has been kept at £20,000 for the current year 2024/25. For your information, the chart below gives a breakdown of how the precept was spent in 2023/24. As well as the precept, payments were received from North Lincolnshire Council for the costs of grass mowing around the village of £4,536, and £800 from the Parochial Church Council towards cutting the grass around the church. In addition, some income is received from the cost of advertising in this newsletter, which more than covers the cost of its printing.

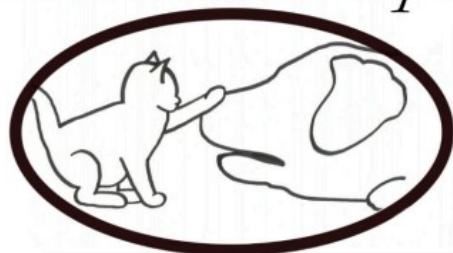

COMMUNITY GARDEN

As many of you are aware Ulceby Parish Council has secured the field behind Station Road on a long term lease from North Lincolnshire Council with the intention of creating a community garden for the benefit of the residents of Ulceby. The Parish Council has progressed this project, employed a landscape gardener and there is now a plan in place for the creation of this community garden.

The area will feature an orchard, nuttury and further copses of trees to encourage wildlife and provide quiet tranquil areas for residents to walk and enjoy. Hedges will also be planted along with wild flower areas. It is also the intention to provide quiet seating areas for residents to enjoy this community area. There is the possibility of adding allotments at a later date if there is a demand for them.

The first copse of trees – hopefully the orchard – will be planted in the autumn/early winter of this year. The Parish Council is keen to involve all the community in this project and would welcome residents to register their interest in sponsoring a tree – perhaps in memory of a loved one – or being involved in planting the trees later this year.
