CHAIRMAN'S REPORT August - October 2024

As the seasons change, there is always something to take in when out and about. The banks of the Humber estuary are a welcome stop off point for thousands of migratory birds as they fly on the long journey from the Arctic to Africa for the Winter, and evenings have seen huge flocks of geese flying in their V formation to conserve energy and deter predators from their safety in numbers. Whilst we see them only during daylight hours, most of their flying is done at night since the air is more stable and there is less turbulence caused by thermals. I never cease to marvel at their flying skills and honking calls, encouraging each other, whilst their instinctive ability to navigate remains a scientific mystery.

Another effect of the changing seasons has been the extremely heavy rainfall at times recently. Those of us who have lived in the village for some years will recall that this has caused severe flooding problems in parts of the village at times in the past, most notably in the Coronation Road area. So far as I have been able to see, the remedial works that were completed then have been successful and there have been no repeat events since.

The village performed very well in the North Lincolnshire Council's Best Kept Village competition. Ulceby won the community planting category, thanks to the flower beds and planters throughout the



village, and special mention was given to the recently refurbished war memorial, residential gardens and tidiness in the village. Thank you to all those who have contributed their time to making the village an attractive place to live, as well as the many dedicated gardeners.

Although the development was not in the village itself, both Ulceby Parish Council and the Road Safety Group had raised concerns about the creation of a major truck service station at Barnetby Top, and its potential effect on the people of the village. The proposed development had space for 200 goods vehicles and two drive-through restaurants, but plans were rejected by North Lincolnshire Council for reasons of road safety and drainage.

There was a public consultation evening at the Village Hall on Tuesday 8 October, to share plans and ideas for the community garden area at Station Road/Martins Road field. The proposed plan includes a community orchard, a nuttery, a hazel coppice, a wild flower meadow and space for allotments (if there is a demand). Dog mess is the most unacceptable and offensive type of litter on our streets.


Dog fouling is not only deeply unpleasant, it is dangerous. Whilst rare, contact with dog excrement can cause toxocariasis – a nasty infection that can lead to dizziness, nausea, asthma and even blindness or seizures.

It's no wonder dog fouling is such a problem – there are estimated to be more than 8 million dogs producing more than 1,000 tonnes of mess every day in the UK alone.

While most dog owners are caring, responsible individuals, there are still some people who do not clean up after their pets.

Anyone who fails to clear up after their dog can be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice of up to £100. If the case goes to court this could cost the owner or person in charge of the animal up to £1,000. The law states that being unaware a dog has fouled or not having a suitable bag is not a reasonable excuse for failing to clean up after your dog. Make sure you pick it up and put it in a bin, or take it home with you. Any public bin can take the waste. There is no excuse to leave it.

If you see any offenders – please report them


